LISTS OF COMMITMENTS ON ESTABLISHMENT (referred to in Article 166 of Title III, Part IV of the Agreement)

Section A: EU PARTY

1. The list of commitments below indicate the economic activities liberalised pursuant to Article 166 of the Agreement and, by means of reservations, the market access and national treatment limitations that apply to establishments and investors of the Republics of the CA Party in those activities. The lists are composed of the following elements:

- (a) A first column indicating the sector or sub-sector in which the commitment is assumed by the Party, and the scope of liberalisation to which the reservations apply.
- (b) A second column describing the applicable reservations.

When the column referred to under (b) only includes Member State-specific reservations, Member States not mentioned therein undertake commitments in the sector concerned without reservations (N.B. the absence of Member State specific reservations in a given sector is without prejudice to horizontal reservations or to sectoral EU-broad reservations that may apply).

Sectors or sub-sectors not mentioned in the list below are not committed.

2. In identifying individual sectors and sub-sectors:

- (a) ISIC rev 3.1 means the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, N° 4, *ISIC REV 3.1*, 2002.

3. The list below does not include measures relating to qualification requirements and procedures, technical standards and licensing requirements and procedures when they do not constitute a market access or a national treatment limitation within the meaning of Articles 164 and 165 of the Agreement. Those measures (for example need to obtain a license, universal service obligations, need to obtain recognition of qualifications in regulated sectors, need to pass specific examinations, including language examinations, non-discriminatory requirement that certain activities may not be carried out in environmental protected zones or

areas of particular historic and artistic interest), even if not listed, apply in any case to investors of the other Party.

4. In accordance with Article 159, paragraph 3 of the Agreement, the list below does not include measures concerning subsidies granted by the Parties.

5. In accordance with Article 164 of the Agreement non-discriminatory requirements as regards the types of legal form of an establishment are not included in the list below.

6. The rights and obligations arising from this list of commitments shall have no self-executing effect and thus confer no rights directly to individual natural persons or juridical persons.

EL SALVADOR

1. The list of commitments below indicates the economic activities inscribed pursuant to Article 166 of the Agreement and by means of reservations, the market access and national treatment limitations, conditions and qualifications that apply to establishments and investors of the EU Party in those activities. The list is composed of the following elements:

- (a) a first column indicating the economic activities in which the commitment is assumed by the Party, and the scope to which the reservations apply; and
- (b) a second column describing the applicable reservations.

2. For the purpose of this list, the term **none** indicates economic activities where there are no limitations, conditions and qualifications to national treatment or market access. The term **unbound** indicates that no national treatment or market access commitments have been made.

For greater certainty, the absence of specific reservations in a given economic activity is without prejudice to the horizontal reservations that apply.

3. Economic activities not mentioned in the list below are not committed.

4. In identifying individual economic activities:

- (a) ISIC rev 3.1 means the International Standard Industrial Classification of all Economic Activities as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, N° 4, *ISIC REV 3.1*, 2002;
- (b) CPC means the Central Products Classification as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, N° 77, *CPC prov*, 1991; and
- (c) CPC ver. 1.0 means the Central Products Classification as set out in Statistical Office of the United Nations, Statistical Papers, Series M, N° 77, *CPC ver 1.0*, 1998.

5. The list below does not include measures relating to qualification requirements and procedures, technical standards and licensing requirements (including any concession, permit, register and other authorisation) and procedures when they do not constitute a market access or a national treatment limitations, conditions and qualifications within the meaning of Articles 164 and 165 of the Agreement. Those measures (for example, need to obtain a license, universal service obligations, need to obtain recognition of qualifications in regulated sectors, need to pass specific examinations, including language examinations, non-discriminatory requirement that certain activities may not be carried out in environmental protected zones or areas of particular historic and artistic interest), even if not listed, apply in any case to investors of the EU Party.

6. In accordance with Article 159, paragraph 3, of the Agreement, the list below does not include measures concerning subsidies granted by the Parties.

7. In accordance with Article 164 of the Agreement non-discriminatory requirements as regards the types of legal form of an establishment are not included in the list below.

8. The rights and obligations arising from this list of commitments shall have no self-executing effect and thus confer no rights directly to individual natural persons or juridical persons.

Horizontal Commitments

1. The airspace, subsoil, and the corresponding continental and insular shelf are owned by El Salvador. The State can grant a concession for the exploitation of the subsoil.

2. Rural land may not be owned by a foreign person, including a branch of a foreign person, if the person is a national of a country or is organised under the law of a country that does not permit Salvadoran nationals to own rural land, except in the case of land to be used for industrial plants.

3. An enterprise organised under Salvadoran law, a majority of whose capital is owned by foreign persons, or a majority of whose partners are foreign persons, is subject to the preceding paragraph.

4. Only the following persons may engage in small scale commerce, industry, and the supply of services in El Salvador:

(a) Salvadoran nationals born in El Salvador; and

(b) Nationals of Costa Rica, Guatemala, Honduras, and Nicaragua.

An enterprise organised under Salvadoran law, a majority of whose capital is owned by foreign persons, or a majority of whose partners are foreign persons, may not establish a small scale enterprise to engage in small scale commerce, industry, and the supply of services.

For purpose of this entry, a small scale enterprise is an enterprise with a capitalisation not greater than \$US 200.000.

5. In cooperative production societies, at least seventy five per cent of the total number of partners must be Salvadoran persons. A branch of an enterprise that is not organised under Salvadoran law is not a Salvadoran person.

For greater certainty, a cooperative production society exists to provide certain benefits to its members including with respect to distribution, sales, management, and technical assistance. Its functions are not only economic but also social.

6. Every employer must employ Salvadorian nationals in a proportion of at least ninety per cent of the personnel of his enterprise. In special circumstances the Ministry of Labour and Social Security may authorise the employment of more foreigners when it is difficult or impossible to replace them with nationals, but employers remain obliged to train Salvadorian personnel under the supervision and control of the mentioned Ministry within a period of not more than five years. The amount of wages of Salvadorians can not be less than eighty five per cent of the total wages paid. This percentage may be changed with the authorisation of the above mentioned Ministry¹.

7. El Salvador may adopt or maintain any measure according rights or preferences to socially or economically disadvantaged minorities.

8. El Salvador may adopt or maintain any measure relating to the execution of social readaptation laws and services, as well as any social services, when they are established or maintained for a public purpose.

9. Nothing in this Agreement, including the present list of specific commitments, will be interpreted in requiring a Party to privatise the supply of public services in the exercise of governmental authority.
10. The market access and national treatment limitations maintained at local governments' level are consolidated, though they are not listed. These limitations shall not be construed as nullifying the commitments taken by El Salvador in the chapter on Public Procurement.
11. El Salvador may require a concession, authorisation, license, permit or any other empowerment titles, as a non-discriminatory condition to perform an economic activity or supply a service.
12. For the purpose of this list, juridical persons constituted according to the laws of El Salvador that have their legal domicile in the country, are considered to be Salvadoran. The laws and regulations established in favour of Salvadorans will be applicable to Salvadoran juridical persons whose partners or capital are, in their majority, foreigners.
13. Economic activities considered as public utilities may be subject to a public monopoly or to exclusive rights granted to natural persons or juridical persons, public or private.

Only the following persons may own a retail business in Panama: (a) a Panamanian national by birth; (b) a natural person who, on the date of entry into force of the 1972 Constitution was a naturalised Panamanian national, the spouse of a Panamanian national, or a natural person who had a child with a Panamanian national; (c) a natural person who has been a naturalised Panamanian national for at least three years; (d) a foreign national or a juridical person organised under the law of a foreign country that owned a lawful retail business in Panama on the date of entry into force of the 1972 Constitution; and (e) a juridical person, whether organised under the laws of Panama or any other country, if ownership of that person is held by natural persons described in subparagraph (a), (b), (c), or (d), as set out in paragraph 5 of Article 293 of the Constitution. 2. Notwithstanding paragraph 1(e), a foreign national may own a juridical person engaged in retail commerce if: (a) the products sold by the juridical person in retail commerce are exclusively products that are produced at its direction and bear its label; or (b) the juridical person is engaged primarily in the sale of a service, and the products that it sells are necessarily associated with the sale of that service. 3. Senior managers and directors of a retail business must meet the same nationality requirements as owners of a retail business.
