Ministers Fast and Rojas Welcome First Meeting of Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement Joint Commission

Minister Fast to lead trade mission to Colombia to build on free trade agreement to create jobs and opportunities for exporters

February 28, 2014 - Ottawa, Ontario - Foreign Affairs, Trade and Development Canada

The Honourable Ed Fast, Minister of International Trade, today welcomed Santiago Rojas Arroyo, Colombia's Minister of Trade, Industry and Tourism, to Ottawa to discuss recent progress in the Canada-Colombia relationship.

Colombia is Canada's fifth-largest trading partner in Latin America and an established market for Canadian businesses, and has been identified as a priority under Canada's Strategy for Engagement in the Americas and Canada's Global Markets Action Plan.

The ministers highlighted the recent opening of Export Development Canada's new permanent office in Bogotá. Minister Fast announced he will be leading a trade mission to Colombia later this year to continue to grow trade and investment opportunities. The ministers also took stock of the benefits of the Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement following the first meeting of the Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement Joint Commission, which is mainly in charge of supervising the implementation of the agreement. The Annual Report Pursuant to the Agreement Concerning Annual Reports on Human Rights and Free Trade Between Canada and the Republic of Colombia will be tabled in Parliament in May 2014. According to the Government of Colombia, more than 285 of the country's companies exported to Canada for the first time, providing Canadian consumers with more choices and lower prices.

The ministers also discussed the progress of the Pacific Alliance, to which Canada is an observer.

Canada has identified opportunities for increased commercial collaboration between Canadian and Colombian companies in the agriculture and agri-food, infrastructure, energy, oil and gas and mining and telecommunications sectors.

Quick Facts

- The Canada-Colombia Free Trade Agreement came into force in August 2011.
- In 2013, bilateral trade totalled \$1.4 billion.
- Major Canadian merchandise exports to Colombia include agriculture and agri-food, advanced manufacturing, forestry products and fertilizers.
- The total stock of Canadian direct investment in Colombia reached almost \$1.8 billion at the end of 2012.
- Colombia is a founding member of the Pacific Alliance, to which Canada became the first non-Latin American observer country in 2012.
