This Agreement shall enter into effect on the date the TPP Agreement has entered into force as between Canada, Mexico and the United States.

I have the further honour to propose that this letter and your letters of confirmation in reply, which are equally valid in English, French and Spanish, shall constitute an agreement between Canada, Mexico and the United States, subject to dispute settlement under Chapter 28 (Dispute Settlement) of the TPP Agreement, which shall enter into force on the date of entry into force of the TPP Agreement as between Canada, Mexico and the United States.
